

‘Roots to Grow and Wings to Fly’

St. Bartholomew’s CE First School PE and Sport Premium Report for April 2019 – March 2020

Following an analysis of the objectives and impact from 2018/19 and a full audit of PE, we have implemented the following for financial year 2019/20.

The Government advise that funding should be used to:

- Develop or add to the PE and sport activities that schools already offer.
- Build capacity and capability within the school to ensure that improvements made now will benefit pupils joining the school in future years.

There are 5 key indicators that schools should expect to see improvement across:

1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – the Chief Medical Officer guidelines recommend that all children and young people aged 5 to 18 engage in at least 60 minutes of physical activity a day, of which 30 minutes should be in school.
2. The profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole-school improvement.
3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport.
4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils.
5. Increased participation in competitive sport.

Carry forward from 2017-18 academic year = £15,875.63
