

**SOMERSET LOCAL AUTHORITY**  
**INSTRUMENT OF GOVERNMENT**

1. The name of the school is St Bartholomew's Church of England First School.
2. The school is a voluntary controlled school.
3. The name of the governing body is:

**The Governing Body of St Bartholomew's Church of England First School.**

4. The governing body shall consist of:

- 2 parent governors
- 1 LA governor
- 1 headteacher
- 1 staff governor
- 2 co-opted governors
- 2 foundation governors

5. Total number of governors: 9

6. The foundation governors shall be appointed as follows:

- i. The Incumbent or Priest in Charge (as the case may be) of the Benefice in which the school is situated for the time being who shall be an ex-officio governor.

The Archdeacon of Taunton ("the Archdeacon") may appoint a substitute governor for such term as he/she shall decide not exceeding the period permitted by the regulations to fill a vacancy in the ex-officio governorship.

In the event that the Archdeacon requires the removal of an ex-officio foundation governor such person shall immediately cease to be a governor.

- ii. 1 person is appointed for the purpose by the Bath and Wells Diocesan Board of Education who shall have been nominated by the Parochial Church Council for the ecclesiastical parish within which the school is situated. A Foundation Governor (other than an ex-officio Foundation Governor) may continue to act until the expiry of his or her term of office notwithstanding the school ceases to be within the ecclesiastical parish whether as a result of a change of the

boundary, constitution or extent of ecclesiastical parish or the removal of the school to a new site.

7. The school has a trust deed.

8. Ethos Statement
